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## Program Notes -- -

THE MIGHTY $97^{\text {TH }}$ is a bright and rousing march for concert band and is respectfully dedicated to the $97^{\text {th }}$ Army Corps of Engineers, an all African-American regiment whose work on the Alaskan Highway Project (aka ALCAN - ALaska-CANada) during World War II, though highly vital to the war effort, is sadly overlooked. With ever-looming challenges such as extremely harsh cold, insufficient accommodations and a tyrannical general whose father had been a Confederate officer in the Civil War, these courageous men nobly persevered and never felt their task was insignificant. This spirited march reflects the integrity and resilience of this great regiment.

## Rehearsal Suggestions -- -

Strict attention to dynamics and tempo will aid greatly to the excitement of the performance. The introduction and opening strains should have a crisp driving quality. At measure 27, the accompanying parts must be sensitive to the low brass/low reed melody. While the melody is smooth at measure 47 , the supporting parts must remain light and bouncy. Measure 79 to the end reassumes the spirited quality as established in the beginning.

## About the Composer ---



William Owens (b. 1963) is a native of Gary, Indiana. His career as a music educator spans over twenty years, and he is very active as a composer, clinician and conductor throughout the United States.

Since 1993, Owens has written over sixty commissioned and published works for middle school and high school concert bands. His music is programmed at prestigious venues, such as the Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic, and appears on required music lists both nationally and abroad. Principal commissions include those from the California Band Directors Association, the Florida Bandmasters Association, the Chicago Public Schools Bureau of Cultural Arts, and the Texas University Interscholastic League. He is the winner of the ASCA Plus award and a two-time recipient of the Forrest L. Buchtel Citation for Excellence in Band Composition. Professional memberships include ASCAP, the American Composers Forum (ACF), the Mansfield (TX) Wind Symphony, and the Texas MEA. William resides in Fort Worth, Texas with his wife Georgia.


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
